Currently, our graduates are taking on crucial roles within the financial sector, spanning diverse areas including investment banking, fund management, equity analysis, sales and trading, consulting, and numerous others. Admission

For JUPAS Students (JUPAS code: JS4252):

Students who take the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination can submit their applications for our programme through the JUPAS system. The first-year intake for this category comprises approximately 33 students.

For Non-JUPAS Students:

Both local and international students who possess qualifications other than the HKDSE results are welcome to apply for our programme through the Non-JUPAS scheme. For detailed information on admission requirements for non-JUPAS and international applicants, please refer to the Office of Admissions and Financial Aid website (http://www.oafa.cuhk.edu.hk/). The first-year intake for this category is approximately 10 students.

Strong Alumni Network

Established in 1998, we are the first quantitative finance programme in Hong Kong. A rich history allows us to build a strong alumni network. Finance Trading Laboratory

Our Finance Trading Laboratory is another valuable resource for our students. Equipped with Bloomberg and Refinitiv terminals, our students have access to real-world data, which allows them to apply theoretical concepts to practical situations.

Vibrant Learning Community

Our programme's ability to attract talented and passionate students from diverse backgrounds has resulted in a dynamic and stimulating learning environment. In addition, our programme and associated society provide a wide range of activities designed to cultivate robust connections among peers and broaden their exposure. As a result, our students have achieved outstanding performance in various investment competitions, including CFA Institute Research Challenge, CQA Investment Challenge, FOAHK Case Competition, HKSII Case Competition, and McGill International Portfolio Challenge.

Free Electives: Discovering Your Passions

We believe that higher education is a time for students to explore their interests and passions. That's why, in addition to the required courses for their programme and the university, students are given 12 credits to choose from the free electives that they want to explore. They can explore a diverse range of disciplines and uncover new passions. They can choose to pursue a minor in specialised fields of study, including but not limited to Computer Science, Economics, French, Mathematics, Philosophy, Statistics, and various others.

Extensive Career Support

Furthermore, we offer extensive career support to our students, encompassing mock interviews, resume critiques, networking events, career counselling, and professional connections. Additionally, we maintain close partnerships with corporations and organisations, facilitating internship and employment prospects for our students.

Your Learning Journey

In order to cultivate our students into future professionals in the financial industry, our programme places equal emphasis on classroom learning and enrichment activities.

Classroom Learning

During the first two years, students are required to take most of their core courses. Afterwards, they can choose the area they want to focus on by taking elective courses (33 credits) and utilising the 12 free credits. This allows students to select a minor in a field they are interested in. Some of the minors our students have chosen include Computer Science, Economics, French, Mathematics, Philosophy, Statistics, and many others.

the US and visit neighboring countries like Canada and Mexico. I cherished this international experience, which made me more independent, open-minded, and confident."



Our Finance trading laboratory is equipped with Bloomberg terminals and Refinitiv Eikon, which enable students to connect to real-world data and facilitate their learning journey. The lab is beneficial not only for coursework but also for job preparation, case studies, and research. Since Bloomberg and Refinitiv Eikon are widely used in financial industry, frequent use of these tools can help students prepare for their future careers as finance professionals.

Career Coaching and Support
